# Blackberry Creek Bag by Heather Athebyne

The sound of running water; the scent of green growing things; the taste of the blackberry you just picked from the bush.

Lacy leaves frame an abundance of delicious blackberries in this bag. Choose a yarn with good stitch definition to make the lace stand out.



## TOOLS AND MATERIALS

Yarn: 100 yd fingering or sport weight yarn

Needles: US size 4 (3.5mm) needles for your favorite circular techniques

**Notions:** 1 or more stitch markers; 24" of 1/8" to 1/4" ribbon or cord for drawstring

Gauge: Gauge is not important for this bag, but my stockinette gauge came in at 22 st/4".

## **ABBREVIATIONS**

**cdd** – centered double decrease

k - knit

**k2tog** – knit 2 sts together

**p** – purl (combination knitters: work Western purls for nicer drawstring eyelets)

ssk - slip 2 sts knitwise, then knit slipped sts

together through back loop

st(s) – stitch(es)

**tbl** - through back loop

yo - yarn over

## **INSTRUCTIONS**

Slip all stitch markers as you work.

Cast on 78 sts with Judy's Magic Cast-On or a provisional cast-on:

- Use Judy's Magic Cast-On if you are using DPNs or Magic Loop. You will not have to close up the bottom in the finishing steps.
- Use a provisional cast-on if you want to use your 9" circulars throughout. If you use Judy's Magic Cast-On with 9" circulars, you will have to use an alternate circular knitting method for the first ten rows or so until the working area can form a circle.
- **1.** Place marker for beginning of row, join to beginning of work if using provisional cast on, k39, place marker, k39 to end of row (78 stitches)

#### **2-6.** k around

Use either Charted or Written pattern instructions to work the bag, then continue to Finishing.

## **CHARTED PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS**

Begin working from Chart A. Work each chart row 2 times per row, for a total of 74 sts (rows 1-6) or 78 sts (rows 7-10) per row. Work Chart A a total of 5 times. Including the first stockinette rows, you have now worked a total of 56 rows.

#### **DRAWSTRING HOLES**

57-60. k around, removing all markers except beginning of row

Begin working from Chart B (Drawstring):

- 61. k1, work chart row 1 of drawstring chart 6 times, k3, work same chart row 6 times, k2
- 62. k1, work chart row 2 of drawstring chart 6 times, k3, work same chart row 6 times, k2
- **63-66.** k around

#### LACY EDGING

- **67.** (yo, k2tog) around
- **68.** k around and continue to Finishing.

## WRITTEN PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

7: (p, k, ssk, p, k2tog, k, yo, k2, k2tog, yo, k, yo, ssk, k2, yo, ssk, k, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, yo, k, yo, ssk, k2, yo, k, ssk, p, k2tog, k, p) 2 times (74 stitches)

**8**: (p, k2, p, k29, p, k2, p) 2 times

**9**: (p, ssk, p, k2tog, yo, k, yo, k, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k2, yo, cdd, yo, k2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k, yo, k, yo, ssk, p, k2tog, p) 2 times

**10**: (p, k, p, k31, p, k, p) 2 times

**11**: (p, cdd, yo, k3, yo, k2, yo, ssk, k, k2tog, yo, k9, yo, ssk, k, k2tog, yo, k2, yo, k3, yo, cdd, p) 2 times

**12**: (p, k35, p) 2 times

**13**: (k2tog, yo, k5, yo, k3, yo, cdd, yo, k3, k2tog, yo, k, yo, ssk, k3, yo, cdd, yo, k3, yo, k5, yo, ssk) 2 times (78 stitches)

**14**: k78

**15**: (p, yo, k, ssk, p, k2tog, k, yo, k8, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k8, yo, k, ssk, p, k2tog, k, yo, p) 2 times

**16**: (p, k3, p, k29, p, k3, p) 2 times

Repeat these ten rows an additional 4 times for a total of 5 repeats. Including the first stockinette rows, you have now worked a total of 56 rows.

#### **DRAWSTRING HOLES**

57-60. k around, removing all markers except beginning of row

**61.** k1, (k2tog, yo, yo, ssk, k2) 6 times, k3, (k2tog, yo, yo, ssk, k2) 6 times, k2

**62.** k1, (k2, p1 [in second yo], k3) 6 times, k3, (k2, p1, k3) 6 times, k2

**63-66.** k around

## **LACY EDGING**

67. (yo, k2tog) around

**68.** k around

## **FINISHING**

Bind off loosely, or with your favorite stretchy bind-off.


If you have used a provisional cast-on, seam the bottom with kitchener stitch or your favorite seaming method.

Weave in ends, and block to 6.5" x 8.5" or as desired. Finish the bag by threading ribbon or cord through the drawstring loops. It is especially pretty to knot beads on the tips of the ribbon.
