

Shamrock Needle Book

free cross stitch pattern by Heather Athebyne



This lucky little needle book stitches up quickly, perfect for a last-minute gift for a friend or for yourself! I bound mine with hard cardboard covers, but you can use your preferred needle book finishing method. If you don't have one yet, try:

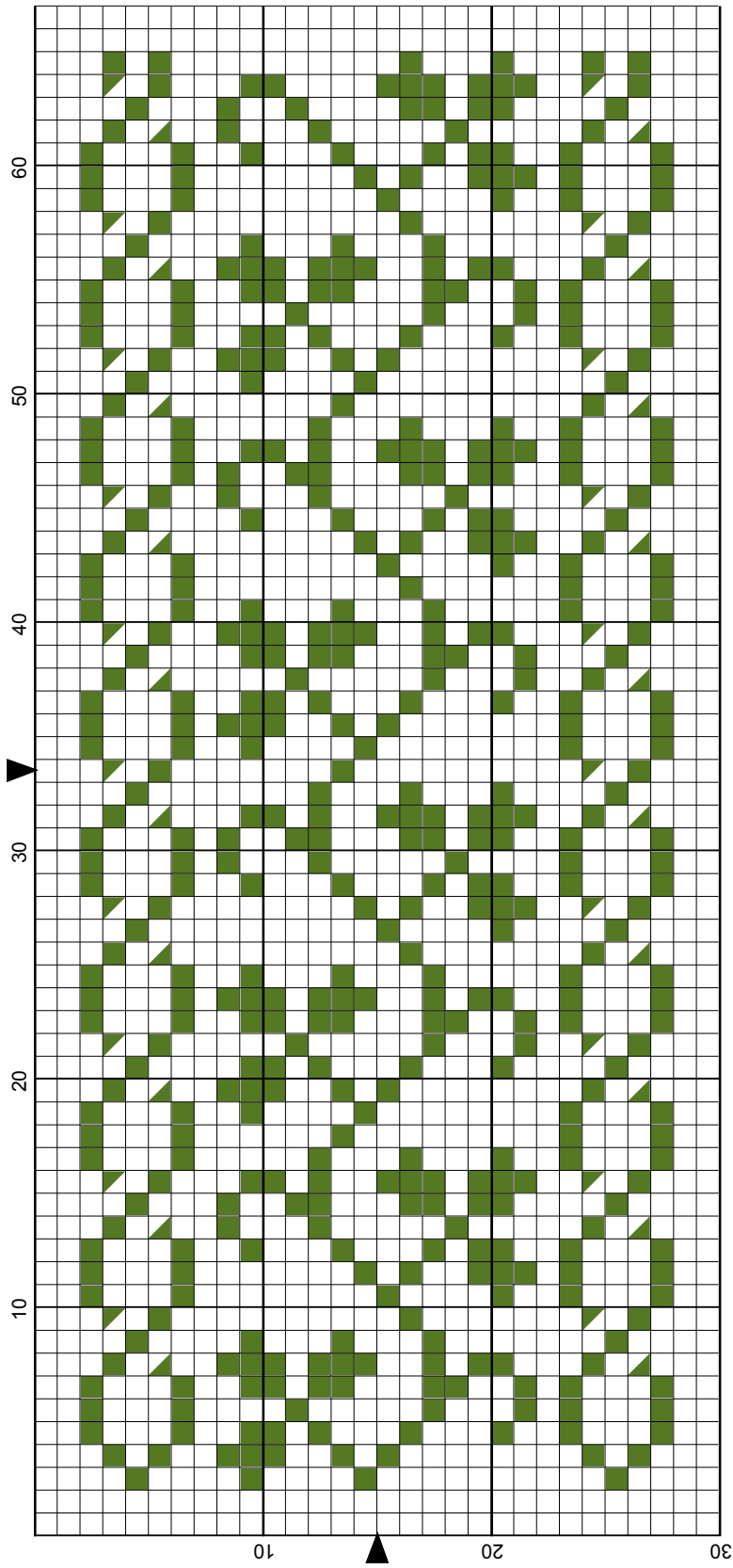
- 63w x 26h stitches – total of 506 cross stitches worked
- 4.5" x 2" (11.5 cm x 5 cm) at 14 stitches per inch
- 4" x 1.75" (10 cm x 4 cm) at 16 stitches per inch
- 3.5" x 1.5" (9 cm x 3.75 cm) at 18 stitches per inch

This design uses full cross stitches and $\frac{3}{4}$ cross stitches. $\frac{3}{4}$ stitches are indicated by half-shaded blocks on the chart. If you are using aida fabric, you will need to pierce the center of the block to work the stitch.

This is an original Athebyne Craftworks design, drawn in part from an antique French cross stitch pattern.
